SUBJECT: Proposed Changes to Fund 69 - 2017

Attached is the revised Capital Projects Plan with changes made after the July Special Projects and Facilities Committee meeting: Attachment A. The Board has now had over a month to think about the various projects and we would like to revisit the list and discuss the projects prior to approving this plan at the September Board meeting.

Upon additional staff review, site inspections, and planning, we are recommending changes to the 2018/19 Fund 69 three-year plan after the preliminary discussion in July. These changes are indicated on Attachment B.

Below is an outline of each area in need of discussion:

Shelton Park: We are currently representing a \$70,000 pathway improvement in Shelton Park in 2018. After additional cost analysis and site inspections, we believe it would be prudent to use funds to develop a Shelton Park master plan. With phase 1 being the pathway repair, our reasoning for this recommendation is two pronged. First, Shelton Park is the second most used passive park in our inventory with significant developments in place. We think it would be beneficial to perform a detailed analysis of the entire park's infrastructure and use before we immediately change the path. Second, during the community input phase necessary for a master plan, we may discover other issues, concerns, or desired amenities at the park worth discussing. We do not want to go back and change completed projects later when further improvements are made. We would recommend budgeting approximately \$20,000 for a site master plan. The size, use, and developments in place at this site warrant a master plan similar to what we did at Takiff Park. We would then budget \$70,000 in 2019/20 to repair the pathway.

**Woodlawn Park:** In further analysis of the Board recommendation to advance Woodlawn Park to next year's project cycle, we are recommending that the budget be increased \$100,000 to a total of \$500,000. With the completion of the West School playground we have raised the bar related to community expectations. This site is large enough to accommodate other amenities such as a small shade shelter, larger tot area, or various other concepts. This additional funding will give us the flexibility to innovate and embrace the community nature of this larger park. This site is not a pocket park. For reference, recent community park projects at West and Friends Parks had project budgets over or near \$500,000.

**Old Green Bay Parks Master Plan:** We have currently represented \$100,000 for master planning of the Old Green Bay parks. This amount is more than needed to develop a master plan. We recommend reducing that amount to \$305,000. We would recommend allocating \$365,000 in 2019/20 for phase 2 of the project.

**Lincoln & Crescent Playground:** We are recommending we advance the completion of the Lincoln & Crescent Playground into the 2018/19 budget. While we work toward further developing a master plan for the trail system along Old Green Bay Road, this project will act as the phase 1 of this plan. This playground is in a deteriorated condition and will likely need removal next year.

**Takiff Early Childhood Playground:** We are recommending replacing the Takiff early childhood playground in 2019/20. After further review, this playground is in a condition that will likely need removal in two to three years. This playground is directly tied to our Children Circle and ELC programs, so we cannot take a chance that this playground is taken out without immediate replacement. We also recommend reducing the amount from \$500,000 to \$400,000. After further review of the site, we believe we can use the same footprint, thus reducing cost a little.

**Robert Everly Wildflower Sanctuary:** I recommend moving the expenses related to wildflower sanctuary maintenance into the operating budget, as natural area maintenance is typically managed over the course of years rather than one capital project.

**Planning:** We are also planning on budgeting for architectural fees every year, so that planning for the projects can start as soon as capital projects are approved and not in the fiscal year that they are being installed.

**Playgrounds:** We do realize that we are recommending four playgrounds for replacement next year. We can handle these projects if we start planning immediately and doing multiple projects may lead to economy of scale. As staff, we would rather be proactive than reactive. We do not want to be in the situation again of taking down a playground due to safety and not be able to immediately replace it.
